New for 2012: Special Behind-The-Scene Attractions Tours and Audio Tours:

This year there are myriad new tours and experiences, each created to enhance the visitor experience and to make St. Augustine and Ponte Vedra more than just a vacation. These include special walking tours such as The Plaza Stroll, a 75-minute tour that reveals the secrets of the Plaza de la Constitucion (the oldest town Plaza in the US) Tour de Chocolate, features chocolate history - from the Aztecs and Mayans to Europe via the Spanish Conquistadors; Whetstone Chocolate Factory Tours featuring tastings, demonstrations and exhibits about harvesting the cacao to wrapping delicious artisan chocolates. You can even have your picture taken working on the chocolate-wrapping belt with Lucy!

In commemoration of the Civil Rights Act, the 40th Accord has just released the <u>Freedom Trail</u> <u>Audio Tour</u>. The tour features a free audio description of events at 31 St. Augustine sites--each of which contributed to the passage of The Civil Rights Act.

Ponce de Leon's Fountain of Youth Archeological Park has been entertaining and enlightening visitors to St. Augustine for generations. Spanish Admiral Pedro Menendez landed here in 1565 to found the city of St. Augustine, the Timucua Indians lived here for hundreds of years and it is thought Ponce de Leon himself landed nearby. The Fountain of Youth Park recently broke ground for its new 16th century shipbuilding project. In the summer of 2012, visitors to the park will be able to see first hand how 16th century Spaniards built their ships in the same location where the city's 16th century boat works were located.

And, the <u>St. Augustine Lighthouse</u> has added three exciting tours and experiences that feature the rich maritime history of Florida's Historic Coast. These include volunteer boat-builders demonstrating **traditional wooden boatbuilding**, a **Lighthouse Behind-the-Scenes** guided tour takes visitors to parts of the Historic Light Station not usually seen, and the Lighthouse's newest tour, <u>The Lost Ships Tour</u> is a hands on experience that demonstrates maritime archaeology and how archaeologists find and excavate ancient shipwrecks found off the bar of St. Augustine.

Events and Happenings:

Throughout the year, hundreds of events take place on Florida's Historic Coast. From THE PLAYERS Championship in May to Nights of Lights in the Christmas season, these events celebrate the area's unique historic and culture.
